INTRODUCTION

Te Maeva Nui NZ (CC63023), is a vibrant celebration of **Cook Islands culture, heritage, and identity** bringing together our communities across Aotearoa to honour our roots and proudly share who we are with the world. It represents a sense of pride through music, language and culture of their ancestors and this is the best platform to achieve that.

Inspired by the spirit of the original Te Maeva Nui in the Cook Islands, this festival is a powerful expression of **unity, creativity, and pride**. It showcases the rich traditions of our tūpuna through captivating performances, language, music, dance, crafts, and storytelling. Te Maeva Nui has brought together generations of Cook Islanders from across the globe - some traveling back home specifically to participate, and represent their home in learning and performing our unique culture, language and heritage.





The Cook Islands population of **80,000** in Aotearoa New Zealand far exceeds that of the homeland, hence why having this festival established is of importance to the diaspora based here.

With **10 teams registered** to participate in this year's Te Maeva Nui NZ Festival 2025, and with each team holding between **140 to 260** registered members involving all ages groups, this is the largest biennial celebration and showcase of Cook Islands language and culture ever held in New Zealand and the world.

Te Maeva Nui NZ is the culmination of years of trial and error in events and cultural celebrations. Headed by the highly skilled Noo Pare QSM of Heimana Music, and in partnership with some of the Cook Islands most influential and high achieving individuals from diverse backgrounds; Te Maeva Nui NZ is a prime opportunity for good, wholesome investment.

More than just a cultural event, Te Maeva Nui NZ is a space where generations connect, communities are strengthened, and the spirit of **te iti tangata** (the people) shines. Whether you're a performer, supporter, or visitor, you are part of something meaningful—a living celebration that keeps our culture thriving across the ocean.



THIS YEAR

Our theme this year is “**Te tauī’anga reva**” (Climate Change) - **CALL TO ACTION!** Our Culture, Our Responsibility, Our Future. As Pacific people, we are on the frontlines of a global crisis that threatens not only our environment, but our way of life, our identities, and our ancestral homelands.

We aim to use the **power of cultural performance**, storytelling, and community engagement to **raise awareness about climate change** from a unique Cook Islands perspective and for our Pacific brothers and sisters. Through traditional dance, song, language, and art, we will amplify indigenous knowledge, promote environmental responsibility, and **inspire action across generations**.

In 2025, Te Maeva Nui NZ proudly connects with the historic milestone of **60 Years of the Cook Islands Constitution**, commemorated in Rarotonga. This celebration marks six decades since our nation embraced self-governance in free association with New Zealand—a pivotal moment in our identity as a people, and in our journey of sovereignty, resilience, and cultural pride. As a diaspora, we honour this legacy and echo the same spirit of pride and unity that began in 1965. through our own celebration in Aotearoa.





SUSTAINABILITY

At Te Maeva Nui NZ we aspire to honor our past while building a **strong, vibrant future** for our people and culture. We are committed to:

- **Cultural sustainability**, by preserving and celebrating the traditions, language, and arts of the Cook Islands, ensuring they are passed on to future generations.
- **Social sustainability**, through inclusive participation of performers involved ages between 0 to 90 years old, strengthens our communities, identity, and shared sense of belonging.
- **Economic sustainability**, by supporting local creatives, businesses, and partnerships that help our festival thrive long-term.

Through these efforts, Te Maeva Nui NZ remains a living, evolving celebration of who we are—rooted in heritage, united in community, and mindful of our future.

Our aim is to continue to grow and sustain this festival – this is vital in order to overcome barriers and prevent the rapid loss of our language and traditions for our tamariki, present and future learning descendants through performing arts and storytelling of Cook Islands Culture, language and heritage, ensuring great confidence and the **importance of self identity.**

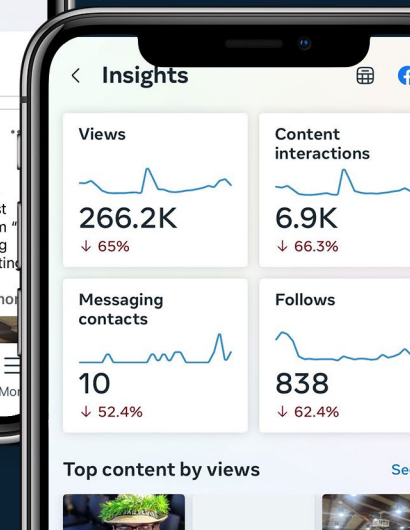
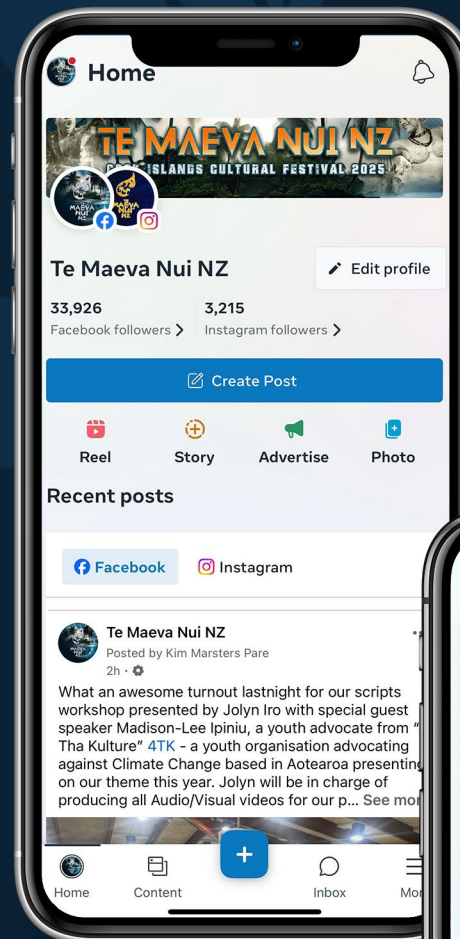
